### **About Blood Donation:**

Each day, thousands of people need donated blood and blood products to keep them in good health or allow them to stay alive.

If a person's blood levels fall due to an accident or illness, or if their blood is not functioning properly, there will not be enough oxygen or other nutrients to maintain their vital organs.

Today in the developed world, most blood donors are unpaid volunteers who donate blood for a community supply. In some countries, established supplies are limited and donors usually give blood when family or friends need a transfusion (directed donation). Many donors donate for several reasons, such as a form of charity, general awareness regarding the demand for blood, increased confidence in oneself, helping a personal friend or relative and social pressure. Despite the many reasons that people donate, not enough potential donors actively donate.

Whole blood is the most flexible type of donation. It can be transfused in its original form, or used to help multiple people when separated into its specific components of red cells, plasma and platelets.

#### Power Red Donation

During a Power Red donation, you give a concentrated dose of red cells, the part of your blood used every day for those needing transfusions as part of their care. This type of donation uses an automated process that separates your red blood cells from the other blood components, and then safely and comfortably returns your plasma and platelets to you.

Red cells from a Power Red donation are typically given to trauma patients, newborns and emergency transfusions during birth, people with sickle cell anemia, and anyone suffering blood loss.

#### **Platelet Donation**

Platelets are tiny cells in your blood that form clots and stop bleeding. Platelets are most often used by cancer patients and others facing life-threatening illnesses and injuries.

In a platelet donation, an apheresis machine collects your platelets along with some plasma, returning your red cells and most of the plasma back to you. A single donation of platelets can yield several transfusable units, whereas it takes about five whole blood donations to make up a single transfusable unit of platelets.

### About Blood Donation Camp:



The NSS Volunteers and Coordinators have supported and coordinated well to make the Blood donation camp a success.






Figure 1: Lighting Lamp




Figure 3: Donating Blood




Figure - 4: Interaction with Students.




Figure 1: Registration




Figure 2: Taking Vaccination



#### **About Republic Day Celebration:**

While India gained independence from the British Raj in 1947, it wasn't until January 26, 1950, that the Indian Constitution came into effect, and India became a sovereign state, declaring it a republic. Dr BR Ambedkar headed the Drafting Committee of the Constitution. Additionally, Constitution Day is celebrated in India on November 26 every year, as on November 26, 1949, the Constituent Assembly of India adopted the Constitution of India.

Republic Day is celebrated with much pomp all across the country. The main attraction of Republic Day celebrations is the annual parade which begins at Rajpath, Delhi, and ends at the India Gate. On this day, the country's President hoists the flag at Rajpath, New Delhi. 



Figure 1: Invocation Song






Figure 2: Welcome Address




Figure 3: Performing Pooja




Figure 4: Flag Hoisting




Figure 5: Addressing the Gathering




Figure - 6: Patriotic Song.




Figure - 7: Vote of Thanks

#### 2. Controlled temperatures






Figure – 3: Giving Awareness about Yoga by Ms. Chandana






Figure - 4: Performing Pranayama.
