

Report on "Human Values Education: Why? and How?" Workshop

Five Days Workshop on "Human Values Education: Why? and How?" was conducted from 15th May 2023 to 19th May 2023, by the Department of Management Studies and Research Centre, K S School of Engineering and Management - Bengaluru - 109.



INAUGURAL PROGRAM DETAILS:

Inauguration Program was held in KSS Architecture seminar hall, at 9.30 am -10.30 am. The Program was anchored by Ms. Deepa L 1st Semester MBA student. Invocation song by Ms. Pooja Vasanth Raj followed by Welcome Speech by the Head of the Department Dr. Shekar H S. The Resource Person Dr. C Panduranga Bhatt former Professor at Indian Institute of Management-Calcutta was introduced by Prof. Arundathi KL. Followed by a Keynote address by the Resource Person. Thereafter, the CEO Dr. K V A Balaji sir and Principal Dr. K Ramanarasimha Addressed the gathering.

OBJECTIVES OF THE WORKSHOP

Human values education should concentrate on producing socially aware, culturally sensitive, and intellectually cosmopolitan students. Human values such as trust, respect, honesty, dignity, and courtesy are the building blocks of any free and advanced society. Human values centred courses, curricula, seminars, readership, and scholarship are the future of education at all levels in plural societies that are marked by differences which politically, economically, socially, and culturally demand co-existence and hence inclusion.

This workshop focused on human values education and its relevance and methodology highlighting Indian experiments and experiences. It focuses on cases ranging from the ancient Indian king Ashoka to contemporary episodes and exercises to inculcate human values of integration, sharing and inclusion as good practices worth emulating.

Teaching of human values, ideal life led by teachers, and examples of extraordinary personalities cited from the epics, poetry, literature and history—all these are of great help in this regard. Developing actionable insights in the students for attaining a desirable personality is a challenge which is worth accepting. This workshop will help in developing Human Values in the students of higher education.

OUTCOMES OF THE WORKSHOP:

The Workshop facilitated the participants to understand the concepts of Human values education and its varied dimensions. Participants were able to impact the students in developing attributes like:

Dr. C Panduranga Bhatta, Former Professor, IIM - CALCUTTA

Dr. C Panduranga Bhatt former Professor at Indian Institute of Management–Calcutta. Sir, has been a prolific Indologist with a career spanning over 4 decades. He has taught at Postgraduate and Doctoral levels at IIM-Calcutta for 2 decades in Leadership, Creativity and Ethics. He was the founder coordinator of Business Ethics & Communication Group, Coordinator of Management Centre for Human Values, and The Editor of the Journal of Human Values published by Sage Publications. He has been a leading consultant and contributor to several research projects undertaken by prestigious Institutions in India and abroad.

There are Books authored by him includes

- o Origin and Genesis of the Chess in 1994,
- Contribution of Karnataka to Sanskrit in 1997,
- o Introduction to Sanskrit Poetics in 2020

- Dice-Play & Origin of Chess in Sanskrit literature in 2022.

He has also published many research articles related to Leadership, Indology, Human Values, Creativity & Innovation, and Organisational Excellence through Leadership in reputed Journals in India and abroad. He has been honoured with a gold medal by The Association of Indian Management Schools for securing the prestigious 'AIMS-ICFAI best teacher' award in 2011. He has been deputed to Indian Council for Cultural relations Chair Professor at Silpakorn University, Bangkok for 2 academic years by the Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India. He holds the position of honorary advisor at smart Al labs.
